A little about Montessori

Maria Montessori was the first woman to graduate with a medical degree from the University of Rome, in Italy. Soon after graduating she was appointed assistant doctor at the psychiatric clinic in San Giovanni Hospital. While working closely with these children Maria developed a great interest for them and began to observe them. She worked confidently with them and gradually saw progress as they were responding to her teaching. Maria then realised that if children with defects and mental disabilities could show such a great response and improvement when working with the equipment and methods of teaching that she discovered, how effective it could be on children without difficulties.

In 1906 Maria opened her first school where she combined the stimulation of senses and education of movement as a system of her own. She observed the children in her school for a long time and came to the conclusion that children enjoyed working. She also noticed that the children repeated activities continuously until they had successfully completed it. Their concentration and interest in an activity was powerful.

Montessori's concepts:

- The teacher must pay attention to the child, rather than the child paying attention to the teacher.
- The child proceeds at his own pace in an environment, controlled to provide means for learning.
- Imaginative teaching materials are the heart of the process
- Each activity is self-correcting, thus enabling the child to proceed at his/her own pace and notices his/her own mistakes as well as correct them.

Why Montessori

Children learn through using concrete materials, which are self-correcting. A Montessori preschool is a special place for children to work on building one's self and becoming an independent thinker.

Montessori work enables them to refine muscular control, build concentration and work towards becoming independent within the world around them.

The prepared environment contains materials and activities that stimulate the curiosity of the child, allowing them to learn and discover freely.

The materials accommodate children of their own age levels.

The children are able to choose their activities, which are guided by their own interests and sensitive periods.

The Montessori environment permits the child to share amongst his peers, as there is only one of each activity.

Montessori teaching is one on one. Each child is taught individually so the teachers know where the child s difficulties are and is able to assist the child.

Snack time:

Parents are asked to provide a healthy 10:40 am snack and juice. No sweets or fizzy cool drinks are allowed. On Friday a treat may be put in their snack box.

Lunchtime:

Children are given a healthy lunch every day which has been developed and approved by a pediatric nutritionist. We include foods that expose children to different textures and are also delicious. All our meals are prepared on the premises by our Chef, Beauty.

Each child will receive pudding after their lunch which consists of either jelly, custard, fruit salad or ice cream. They also receive either water or some of our home made iced tea made with rooibos tea and fresh fruit juice.

Afternoon snack:

Our full day children will receive an afternoon snack at 3:45pm. This snack consists of fresh brown bread that will have a different filling each day, a fruit and either water or our delicious homemade Ice Tea..

What must you bring to school:

Each child should bring a small schoolbag containing a spare set of clothing in case of any accidents during the day. Please make sure these items of clothing are suitable for all types of weather as well as labeled. During the COVID-19 pandemic we also ask that each child has 2 spare masks each day.

If your child is not toilet trained yet, please ensure you send enough nappies, wet wipes and nappy cream in his/her bag.



Dropping off and collection of children:

Due to COVID, we have adjusted our drop off and collection policy. Parents will be asked to fill out an online COVID 19 questionnaire each morning before they drop their child at school. When you arrive we will come to your car to take your child's temperature, we will then sanitize their hands, shoes and belongings and allow them inside for a fun filled day. When they go home we will first sanitize their hands and take their temperature and then we will walk them to your car. Please note no parents are allowed in the school. Please inform us if your child is going home with someone else, whether it is with another child or someone unknown to us. If we do not know about any change of plans, we will not allow your child to leave the premises.

Discipline:

Little Minds Montessori does not permit corporal punishment to any child. The Montessori method of discipline is to explain to the child what they have done wrong and have them sit on a "grow good" chair. Their age will help determine how long they have to sit on the chair EG: 2-year-old children will sit for 2 minutes. If any serious behaviour persists EG: biting, pinching, kicking etc the parents will be notified so we can resolve the problem together.

We believe that change is a big culprit in children's behavior. Change in either routine, diet or medication. If there has been any change please let us know so we can help your little one communicate how he is feeling to try and avoid them hurting other children or acting out.

Toilet training:

We do not expect your child to be toilet trained. We are happy to assist you with toilet training, when it becomes apparent that your child is ready to be toilet trained. Toilet training will not become Little Minds Montessori's responsibility; it will only be done in conjunction with the parents. Please do not rush toilet training, since it often takes far longer to toilet train a child that is not completely ready.

Sick children and medication:

Please keep your child at home if they are sick or show any of the following symptoms: diarrhoea, vomiting, conjunctivitis, spots or rashes, temperature and colds. This will prevent them from infecting any other child as well as the teachers.

If your child will not be attending school, please notify the school as soon as possible.

If your child becomes ill during the day, you will be notified immediately and asked to collect your little one as soon as possible.

The Health department has recently introduced a rule that no medication is allowed to be administered at schools; therefore, we will no longer be allowed to administer any antibiotics to your child.

In the event of an accident or illness requiring immediate medical treatment, Little Minds Montessori staff is responsible and reserves the right for obtaining medical attention and treatment for your child.

We Are COVID Compliant:

Little Minds is proud to be 100% COVID compliant.

Our school is deep cleaned and sanitized numerous times throughout the day. Each week our school is fogged by a trusted company called Sprinkle Spray to help reduce the risk of germs and bacteria in our school.

We also do not allow visitors on our premises during the week while the children are here to help eliminate the spread of germs.

All children over the age of 2 year old are encouraged to wear either a mask or shield during class time and playtime.

We do believe that children still need the physical interaction as that is how they learn and play, so therefore we still encourage them to play together. We at Little Minds have taught our children that in our clean bubble we are safe, as long as we wear our masks as well as wash and sanitize our hands we are safe. They have adapted so well to our new normal, we are extremely proud of them.

Parents are required to complete an online screening each morning and if your child is showing any symptoms to please not allow them to come to school. Before the children enter they have their temperature taken, then they have their hands, shoes and bags sanitized.

All our staff have done extensive training about the coronavirus as well ways to keep our little ones safe.

We will send home applications forms for any extra murals that your child may be showing an interest in. Please note that extra murals are not compulsory.

We have chosen extra murals that we are comfortable in knowing they are following all COVID 19 protocols, they have assured us that they will sanitize and disinfect their equipment before visiting our school. We will ensure that they fill out the COVID screening and we will take their temperature and sanitize before they enter.



Fee structure:

School fees for 2022 are as follows:

A non-refundable deposit of R1000 is payable as soon as possible to secure your child's spot.

Please note that Phyzz Ed is included in your school fees and this extra mural will take place once a week for half an hour.

Option A:

12 monthly payments. (January – December)

Payable by the 2nd day of each month.

Option B:

11 Monthly payments (January – November)

If you enrol your child in the middle of the year, we can accommodate you by taking Decembers school fees and dividing it by the amount of months that you are with us.

Equipment & Stationery Fee:

This is R1500 once off for the year and includes the following:

Hearing screening done in March

Eye screening done in May

Dentist visit done in July

Metal juice bottle labelled with a photo of your child

Hat with removable visor labelled with your child's name

All your child's stationery EG: HB pencils, colouring in pencils, twistees, scissor, glue sticks, eraser, work file and work books. Each child will be given a pencil box to keep their items safe.

Please note that 50% of this is payable with January school fees and the remainder is payable with April school fees. If you would like to pay the full amount with your January school fees you are more than welcome to.

Family discount:

If you have 2 children attending Little Minds Montessori in 2022, you will receive a 5% discount on your total bill. If you have 3 children attending Little Minds Montessori in 2022, you will receive a 7% discount on your total bill.

Termly items:

Parents are required to bring the following items each term: (please note that there are 3 terms.)

- 1 liquid hand soap
- 2 boxes of tissues
- 2 packets of wet wipes for wiping faces (we do not use face clothes as it is unhygienic)
- 1 packet wet wipes if your child is not yet toilet trained (we will notify you once it is finished)
- 4 toilet rolls
- 1 new bottle of liquid sunscreen (we will notify you once it is finished)

School holidays:

Little Minds Montessori is an independent/ private school although our doors are open during the school holidays and during this time we like to keep the children in their routine and continue with our Montessori workday.
